About the School:

- The Alpha Upper Primary School is an institution that has been established to provide quality education, help children grow, and strive for excellence.
- It was established in the year 2009 and has been providing free education, since its inception.
- The school is located in Thakkasila, a small village near the City of Kurnool. It is home to about 300 families; most men and women here are daily-wage Laborers that earn very little income.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING

Vocational Training is provided to women and youth from poor background to earn their livelihood and support their family. To this end, the Trust has been continuously providing training to them in vocation of Tailoring through their centers known as “AVTC CENTERS” at the following locations –

AVTC Rajupeta & Chinthaguntapalem Graduation:

- On 3rd February, 2020, 28th Students graduated the AVTC program, 5 from Chinthaguntapalem and 23 from Rajupeta, Machilipatnam, and Andhra Pradesh.
- After the graduation ceremony, students came forward to give their examples.
- “I faced a lot of hardships in my life because of which I had to drop out of High School. I wanted to learn tailoring so that I could work from home. I thank AVTC for providing me this platform.” Said Gayatri, a student of AVTC.



Inauguration of AVTC Satyanarayanapuram:

- On 4th February 2020, Chinthaguntapalem AVTC centre was shifted to Satyanarayanapuram, Machilipatnam, Andhra Pradesh.
- 20 students are currently attending this program. All the students are home makers with very less experience in stitching.
- “I want to learn stitching so that I will be able to help my family financially. I also want to start a small tailoring business someday.” Said Rajini, a student of AVTC.



AVTC Yapral Graduation:

- On 5th February, 2020, 24 students from AVTC Yapral, Hyderabad, Telangana graduated.
- The students appreciated the time and money invested in them, and sincerely thanked Hope for Today (HFT) and the donors for the opportunity provided.

- “I always wanted to brush up on my tailoring skills so that I can setup a small business and support my family.” Said Jaya a student of AVTC who was always punctual to the class.



NUTRITION SUPPORT TO CHILDREN

The Trust provides Soya Milk to the inmates of the homes run by it and needy children from slums. For this purpose, the Trust has bought machinery for the preparation and supply of nutrition material.

Rag pickers are one of the most vulnerable lot and to mold them into a good way of life is only possible through education. Hence a small initiative of providing them with food and education once a week during nights is carried out by Trust at YMCA, Narayanguda, Hyderabad.

There are about 50 beneficiaries.

To provide relief to the poor and old Widows who have no regular means of livelihood the Trust extends financial support monthly and material support annually to them.

Visionary Leader

Goal Setting

The process involves the development of an action plan designed to motivate and guide a person or a group toward a particular goal. Goal setting can be guided by goal-setting criteria (or rules) such as SMART criteria. SMART is a tool that can be used to achieve goals and help in making the goals Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant and Time-bound.
