Hope for Today is a charitable trust dedicated to enhancing the overall quality of life for individuals from underprivileged and marginalized communities, transcending barriers of caste, religion, or language. In a world where extreme poverty limits access to basic needs, our work is focused on bridging the gap between the marginalized and mainstream society.

Our Vision is to lead in spreading hope, transforming lives, and fostering sustainable livelihoods. Guided by core values of Compassion, Integrity, and Love, we address the fundamental challenges faced by the homeless, destitute, and impoverished segments of the population.

- **Essential Support Systems:** Delivering critical Nutrition Support via Soya Milk Centres, ensuring the well-being of elderly Widows, and extending a lifeline through Medical Camps.

- **100% Pass Rate:** We are delighted to report that all children successfully cleared their final examinations with flying colours. This achievement is a credit to the children's hard work and the consistent academic support they receive from the Home's staff.

- **Effective Coordination:** Our local coordinator ensures a regular and detailed update on the children's progress, maintaining a vital link between the Home, the school, and our central administration.

Children's Day Celebration (November 14, 2024)

Children's Day was a highlight of the year, celebrated with immense enthusiasm at the Hope International Academy, reinforcing a sense of joy and togetherness within the community.

Spotlight: Diya Jessica — The Power of Unity

Diya Jessica, a student in Kindergarten at St. Ann's High School, demonstrated exceptional communication skills and confident stage presence by participating in two major competitions.

- **Storytelling Champion:** Diya confidently narrated "The Lion and the Cows," a classic fable focused on the moral, "Unity is Strength." Her clear voice and engaging expressions captivated the audience. Diya passionately connected the story's theme—that separated, the cows were easy targets, but united, they drove the lion away—to a powerful life lesson on the importance of working together to overcome challenges.
- **Handwriting Excellence:** In a proud moment, Diya achieved 3rd Prize in the Handwriting Competition held for all UKG (Kindergarten) sections at St. Ann's High School. With a total strength of nearly 250-300 students, only 77 young learners were selected. Diya's success, noted for her neat, focused strokes and delicate curves, is a testament to her patience, dedication, and budding passion for detailed expression.

ALPHA UPPER PRIMARY SCHOOL, TAKKASILA (KURNOOL)

HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT

The Alpha Upper Primary School in Takkasila, Kurnool, continues to be a center of excellence, focusing on providing free, high-quality education and enriching the children's lives through cultural and experiential activities. The year was marked by strong academic results and enthusiastic participation in community events.



Academic and Operational Highlights

The 2024-2025 academic year began successfully, building on a foundation of stellar performance.

- **Exceptional Exam Results (April 2024):** We are proud to report a 100% pass rate, with all 96 children clearing their final examinations with flying colours. Parents expressed

deep gratitude for the opportunity of free quality education, vowing to ensure their children utilize it to the maximum.

- **Progress Card Distribution:** On April 22, 2024, Joseph, John, and Srikanth visited the school to meet with children and parents and personally distribute progress cards, reinforcing the commitment to transparency and parental engagement.
- **New Academic Session:** The 2024-2025 academic year commenced successfully with a student strength of 95 children. Representatives Srikanth and John oversaw the distribution of free academic books, ensuring all children were prepared to learn and grow.



Civic and Cultural Celebrations

The school observed several important national and professional days with great enthusiasm, promoting civic responsibility and respect among the students.

- **Independence Day (August 15th):** The 78th Indian Independence Day was celebrated with patriotic fervour. The day included flag hoisting, the singing of the National Anthem, a speech by Mr. John, and captivating student performances, including skits, cultural dances, and orations.
- **Teacher's Day (September 5th):** The staff and students celebrated Teacher's Day, honouring the dedication of the educators who tirelessly shape the children's futures.

The event featured fun performances and heartfelt speeches delivered by the students themselves, filled with gratitude and hope for their future.

All celebrations concluded with the distribution of sweets, fostering a spirit of togetherness.

ALPHA VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTERS (AVTC): EMPOWERING FUTURES

The Alpha Vocational Training Centers (AVTC) are central to our mission of providing sustainable livelihoods and economic independence to women from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. By offering free vocational courses in skills like Sewing and Beautician training, AVTC directly addresses the cycle of poverty, giving students the tools to start their own businesses or secure stable employment.



AVTC Center Snapshot: Enrollment and Expansion

This year saw both consistent operation in established centers and strategic expansion into new areas, significantly increasing our reach and impact.

AVTC Machilipatnam Graduation (August 28th)

- A total of 32 students (15 from Rajupeta and 17 from Kalekanapeta) successfully completed the Sewing course.
- **Impact:** The graduates—many of whom balanced household duties with coursework—displayed their beautiful work, testifying to the transformation the skills brought to their lives. They credited the teachers for their persistent guidance and expressed deep gratitude to the organization for equipping them with skills that lead to a remarkable change in their livelihoods.

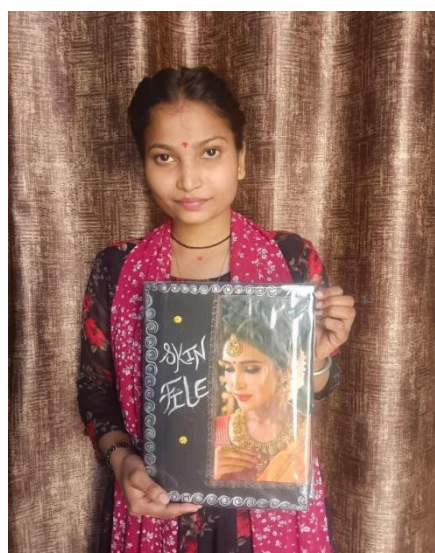
AVTC Saharanpur Graduations (October 26, 2024 & February 25, 2025)

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The graduates from Saharanpur expressed immense gratitude, emphasizing that the free training and unwavering support from Hope for Today provided the courage to step into the world with the determination to build a brighter future.



New Initiatives and Growth

We are committed to extending our reach to underserved communities, exemplified by our newest center.

- **Launch of AVTC Bargur (Tamil Nadu):** A new center was established in Bargur, Tamil Nadu, specifically targeting women from remote settlements in the Bargur Hills where access to quality training is severely limited. Students are eager to acquire hands-on experience in sewing, viewing the AVTC as a gateway to better employment prospects and personal development, ultimately improving their livelihoods and contributing positively to their communities.
- **Progress at AVTC Abids (Hyderabad):** The Abids center is steadily progressing, attracting 7 new students motivated to gain employable skills in technical fields. Upon completion, these students expect to secure stable jobs or launch small businesses.



SOYA MILK DISTRIBUTION: SUSTAINING HEALTH AND NUTRITION

Our Soya Milk Distribution program continues to be a crucial component of our nutritional support efforts, providing essential protein and nourishment to vulnerable communities, particularly slum children and those affected by leprosy.



Program Operations and Reach

The production and distribution network remains consistently active, delivering fresh, protein-rich soya milk multiple times a week.

- **Consistent Production:** The plant in Hyderabad continues to operate efficiently, producing fresh soya milk (distributed in 200ml bottles or glasses) for distribution thrice a week in slum areas.

- **Dedicated Distribution Teams:**
 - **Hyderabad (ACTC Campus & Slums):** Mr. Pavan Kumar oversees distribution, ensuring continuous service to children in the ACTC Campus and various slum areas.
 - **Bihar (Jehanabad):** Mr. Kaushalendra remains dedicated to serving the children in Jehanabad.
 - **Nellore (Andhra Pradesh):** Mr. Robert focuses on a specific and vital community, consistently providing soya milk to those affected by Leprosy.
- **Summer Suspension Note:** The distribution in Hyderabad and Nellore was temporarily suspended during the summer due to heat waves, a necessary precaution to ensure the safety and quality of the perishable product.



Distribution Data Summary

Impact and Significance

The regular provision of soya milk serves as a vital source of affordable protein and micronutrients, directly combating malnutrition in vulnerable groups. The dedication of the distribution team ensures that this essential nutritional support reaches those who need it most, contributing directly to the health, energy, and overall well-being of the beneficiaries.



NUTRITIOUS FOOD DISTRIBUTION: A LIFELINE FOR HIV-AFFECTED CHILDREN

Our Nutritious Food Distribution program in Nellore, Andhra Pradesh, stands as a critical pillar of support for HIV-infected individuals and children living below the poverty line. This initiative is a direct response to the urgent need for consistent nourishment among a highly vulnerable population group whose immune systems are compromised.



The Critical Need and Our Reach

The beneficiaries face immense challenges due to their geographical location and health status.

- **Vulnerable Demographics:** The program primarily serves individuals aged 10 to 25 years who reside in remote Mandals of Nellore district, including Buchireddypalem, Kavali, Muthukur, and Kovur.
- **Accessibility Crisis:** These remote areas have absolutely no access to basic medical facilities or consistent, nutritious food, making the food distribution a lifeline.
- **Consistent Support:** The program, facilitated by Rev. Titus Nirmal and visited by Joseph on February 19, 2025, has demonstrated consistent growth in its reach:
 - **January – March:** 25 children/individuals served.
 - **April – September 2024:** Consistently serving 50 children/individuals each month.
 - **Ongoing Goal:** We aspire to extend our reach to a greater number of silently suffering children in the near future, recognizing the overwhelming need.



Specific Nutritional Impact

The food distributed is more than a meal; it is critical medical support that helps beneficiaries fight their illness.

- **Carefully Curated Packs:** The food packs are meticulously curated to provide essential nutrients specifically needed by individuals with compromised immune systems. Items include dry fruits, dates, lentils, and other wholesome items.
- **Health and Strength:** Proper nutrition is paramount in helping those living with HIV maintain their health, build strength, and combat infections that their fragile bodies would otherwise struggle to fight.



Gratitude and Empowerment

The profound gratitude expressed by the beneficiaries underscores the program's success in delivering not just sustenance, but hope and dignity.

"This food gives us strength to fight another day. We feel truly blessed to receive this kindness."

This compassionate service and unwavering love from Hope for Today provides the reassurance that these children are not alone. It eases their pain, nurtures their bodies, and gives them the strength and hope for a better tomorrow.



WIDOW SUPPORT: PROVIDING DIGNITY AND HOLISTIC CARE

Our Widow Support program is dedicated to providing ongoing financial stability, compassionate visitation, and critical healthcare to elderly widows, ensuring they live their later years with dignity and comfort.



Consistent Support and Oversight

We currently provide continued support to 17 elderly widows who are reported to be in good health.

- **Dedicated Local Coordination:** Our local coordinator ensures a strong, personal connection by visiting the beneficiaries regularly, monitoring their well-being, and providing a direct line of communication for any emerging needs.
- **Heartfelt Gratitude:** The widows consistently convey their profound gratitude for the continued support, which provides essential stability in their lives.



Care and Compassion in Machilipatnam

A key highlight of the year was a special visit to the Machilipatnam beneficiaries, reinforcing our commitment to their holistic well-being.

- **Visit and Bonding (August 28th):** John and Joseph visited the widows in Machilipatnam, spending quality time with each person to discuss their well-being.
- **Provision of Essentials:** During the visit, the team provided each widow with a freshly packed, delicious meal and a nutritious fruit packet containing bananas, papaya, oranges, and apples.
- **Mutual Encouragement:** The visit was a source of joy for the widows and, equally, a deeply moving and compassionate experience for our team, reinforcing the value of connection and human compassion. The widows send their love and gratitude for your continued prayers and support.



Critical Medical Support

In Machilipatnam, we provide essential, routine healthcare to address the unique needs of the elderly.

- **Skilled Healthcare:** The widows receive consistent medical support from Mrs. Suseela, a skilled nurse with extensive experience.
- **Bimonthly Check-ups:** Mrs. Suseela visits the widows every two weeks, providing crucial services including routine check-ups, medication management, and guidance on managing specific health issues.
- **Increased Well-being:** This regular, consistent care helps the widows manage their health effectively and ensures their well-being is closely monitored, leaving them feeling supported and secure in their daily lives.

RAG PICKER REHABILITATION: RESCUE, RECOVERY, AND SECOND CHANCES

Our Rag Picker Rehabilitation initiative extends our compassion to individuals facing extreme hardship, often found abandoned and suffering from severe health and mental distress. This program focuses on rescue, medical recovery, and restoring the dignity of those who have lost everything.



Restoring Lives: The Journey of Krishna

The story of Krishna, a man whose life was derailed by relentless physical toil and subsequent abandonment, illustrates the critical role of our rehabilitation program.

- **Background:** Krishna, a laundry worker (Dhobi) whose job involved pressing clothes with a coal-filled iron, endured years of hardship. His meager income from this work, which included daily accommodation and food, was insufficient to support his family after his marriage in 2014.
- **Health and Abandonment:** The prolonged exposure to heat led to severe health issues, including lung infection and swollen feet, weakening his internal systems. Tragically, his wife left with their son, and her family took his small property. Krishna was later found abandoned by the roadside.
- **Recovery:** Rescued by our partner and brought into rehabilitation, Krishna is now two months into the program and showing significant recovery. He is highly focused on improving both his physical and mental health, deeply grateful to Hope for Today for the kindness bestowed upon him.

A Second Chance: The Story of Prabhakar

The case of Prabhakar highlights the devastating consequences of mental health struggles compounded by separation and poverty.

- **Background:** Prabhakar, 40, formerly worked as a watchman. Following irreconcilable differences, his wife left with their son in 2014.

- **Crisis and Rescue:** The separation led Prabhakar into a severe state of depression, quickly resulting in serious medical complications. He was discovered outside a hospital in a deplorable condition and was rescued by our partner in September.
- **Progress:** After one month in the rehabilitation program, Prabhakar's health is progressing well. He expresses profound gratitude to Hope for Today for the kindness and for giving him a much-needed second chance at life and health.

These testimonies underscore that the rehabilitation program is not just about physical shelter, but about providing medical care, mental support, and dignity to restart life when all hope seemed lost.



COMMUNITY HEALTH INITIATIVE: FREE MEDICAL CAMP IN RAMANAYYAPETA

On a bright and hopeful day in Ramanayyapeta (Yeleswaram Mandal, Andhra Pradesh), Hope for Today delivered critical, specialized healthcare to a community long deprived of essential medical services. This initiative provided immediate relief and vital health education, directly addressing the region's most pressing challenge.



Addressing a Health Crisis: The Need

Ramanayyapeta, a remote village in a rural landscape, grappled with a severe lack of healthcare infrastructure.

- **Geographical Isolation:** Residents relied on distant healthcare centers, making the journey financially and physically taxing, especially for the elderly and daily wage workers.
- **The Scourge of Malaria:** The region's dense forests and stagnant water sources created a breeding ground for mosquitoes, leading to frequent and devastating malaria outbreaks. The lack of accessible medical care meant delayed treatment, often leaving entire families bedridden for weeks and living in constant fear of fatal consequences. The impact was not just physical, but an emotional crisis rooted in hopelessness.

Strategic Response and Specialized Care

In light of these dire circumstances, Hope for Today organized a comprehensive medical camp as a life-saving intervention.

- **Dedicated Team:** The camp, held from 9 AM to 3 PM, deployed a skilled team of 22 doctors from G.S.L General Hospital.
- **Specialized Services:** Care was offered across crucial specializations, including:

- General Medicine
- Dentistry
- ENT (Ear, Nose, and Throat)
- Gynecology
- Orthopedics
- **Targeted Treatment:** Doctors worked tirelessly to offer consultations and distribute medicines, specifically addressing the long-lasting effects of malaria, physical strain (joint pain), and respiratory issues that had gone untreated for years.





Measurable Impact and Renewed Hope

The medical camp's success was measured both in numbers and in the palpable sense of relief it delivered to the community.

- **Immediate Reach:** Over 300 villagers received medical assistance, many of them for the first time in years.
- **Prevention and Education:** The team provided vital discussions on hygiene and the importance of seeking early medical help to prevent future outbreaks, empowering the villagers with essential knowledge.
- **Restored Dignity:** For the elderly and children, the camp was a reminder that help was within reach. The overwhelming gratitude and relief on the faces of the villagers marked a significant step toward breaking free from the cycle of suffering caused by disease and neglect.

The Free Medical Camp in Ramanayyapeta was more than a medical service; it was a powerful affirmation that the health of this community matters, leaving the residents with a renewed sense of hope for their future.



DISASTER RELIEF: HOPE AMIDST THE FLOODS IN VIJAYAWADA

In the aftermath of the devastating September 2024 floods that caused widespread destruction and displacement in Vijayawada, Hope for Today swiftly mobilized a relief program to provide immediate assistance and restore stability to affected communities.



The Crisis and Our Compassionate Response

Torrential rains and overflowing rivers inundated residential areas, leaving families without shelter, food, or basic necessities. Our relief program demonstrated the spirit of community and humanity in a time of urgent need.

- **Relief Program Date:** December 14, 2024
- **Targeted Aid:** The relief focused on slum families who were severely impacted.
- **Total Beneficiaries Reached:** 1,256 individuals/families received assistance.

Comprehensive Aid Distribution

The aid was structured to meet both the immediate need for sustenance and the requirement for long-term recovery, ensuring affected families could begin to stabilize their lives.

The provision of Grocery Kits, Blankets and Medical Assistance and Other Necessities served as a lifeline for the flood-affected families, offering much-needed sustenance and essentials for survival.

This initiative provided not only tangible assistance but also a beacon of hope and comfort to the people of Vijayawada during one of their darkest times, reflecting the true power of collective care.

HUMANITARIAN OUTREACH: THE GIFT OF WARMTH AND DIGNITY

Our humanitarian outreach programs are designed to provide immediate relief, comfort, and a renewed sense of dignity to vulnerable communities facing extreme poverty and harsh weather conditions.



The Ray of Hope: Clothes and Essentials Distribution

On **December 15, 2024**, Hope for Today conducted a major distribution drive in the interior villages of Jukkal, Adavi Rangapuram, and Chapalabanda in Warangal, Telangana. This collective endeavor provided essential items to residents, many of whom are farmers and daily laborers living hand-to-mouth.

- **Items Distributed:** The relief effort included donations of used clothes, soap bars, detergents, food items, and warm blankets.
- **Impact on Dignity:** The carefully packed bundles provided more than just material relief. For a farmer, the new shirts meant his children would be spared the ridicule they faced at school. For a widowed mother, the blankets provided comfort against the biting winter nights.
- **Restoring Faith:** The day was a mission to restore faith and dignity. Our team spent time sitting with the villagers, listening to their stories, and ensuring the program sowed the seeds of a stronger community united by shared humanity.

Blanket Distribution: Extending Warmth Across India

Beyond the localized drive in Telangana, our blanket distribution program provided critical warmth across 16 locations in 9 states, helping individuals survive the cold season.

The program successfully distributed **1,320 blankets** to vulnerable beneficiaries across the country:

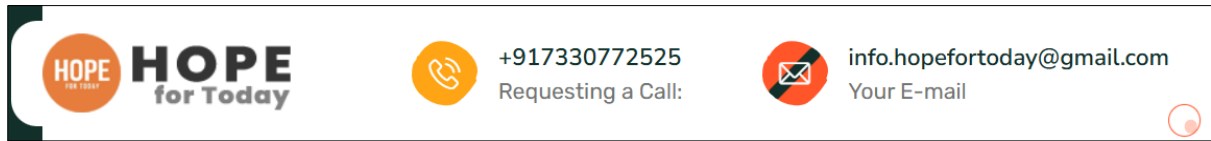
